Our Strengths

As a school we constantly review where we are as a school and how we can continuously improve to ensure that your child gets the best education at Ysgol Bro Cinmeirch. Through the process of self-evaluation and continuous review across the school we identify our key priorities for improvement.







<u>Leadership</u>

- The school's clear vision has been created with the contribution of all stakeholders.
- High expectations are set across the school.
- There are good monitoring processes in place in the school where all stakeholders are allowed to give their opinion. That allows us to know our school very well and plan the next steps.
- The school's finances are carefully monitored by the school and the Local Education Authority.
 Various grants such as the PDG (Pupil Development Grant) and the School Improvement Grant are spent effectively for the benefit of pupils and staff.

<u>Teaching and Learning</u>

- The learning environment is safe and interesting, where there is clear respect between pupils and teachers which creates an atmosphere where pupils are ready to work hard and thrive.
- There is a continuous and strong focus on developing Literacy, Numeracy and Digital skills consistently across the school and the children's skills are developing very well.

Curriculum

- Our Curriculum is suitable for learners of different ages and abilities.
- Pupil and parent's voice has a prominent place in our Curriculum where their input is taken into account when planning a unit of work.
- Most school's work is shared on Google Classrooms and SeeSaw, regular information is shared through the weekly newsletter and Twitter.
- There's an opportunity twice within the year for parents' evenings to share written opinions and end-of-year reports to keep parents aware of a child's progress and any developments at school.

Well-being, Equity and Inclusion

- The ALN reform journey is very firmly established in the everyday life of the school and the ALN is very knowledgeable of the law when guiding the staff and the support for pupils with ALN.
- There are robust arrangements in place to support the welfare of staff, learners and the community.
