## Previous Success

<u>Developing learners' Welsh oral skills.</u>

The 'Criw Cymraeg' have created Welsh artist of the month. The Welsh Ambassadors choose various artists within the year. There are often opportunities to listen to Welsh music at school.

The Welsh TV show of the month has also been arranged by the 'Criw Cymraeg'. They choose something for the younger children and one more suitable for the older children. It's shared in our newsletter and there is an opportunity to listen to the show in the breakfast club.

Improving reading proficiency in Welsh.

We have invested in new Welsh books i.e Magi Ann, Tric a Clic and 'Cychwyn Eto' books. This ensures a smooth transition between year 2 and 3.

Invested in 'Darllen Co' - an opportunity to read books for free at home.

Voting Zone in year 1-6 to encourage more pupils to read various novels.

<u>Further improve the provision and</u> <u>develop a culture of independent</u> <u>learning.</u>

Embedding '3 before me' in all classes and the '5 M' in year 5 and 6 to promote independence.

Learning areas in the Foundation Learners and afternoon challenges in key stage 2. 'Chilies' challenges in the areas and an opportunity for them to choose their challenge.

This is an overview of the areas of school development that we will focus on during the 2025-2026 academic year to ensure that we continue to provide the best for our pupils.


Improve handwriting and presentation of pupils' work.
